

Exemption under the Public Health (COVID-19 Restrictions on Gathering and Movement) Order (No 5) 2020 (NSW) under the Public Health Act 2010 (NSW) – Remembrance Day

I, Brad Hazzard, Minister for Health and Medical Research, under clause 30 of the *Public Health* (COVID-19 Restrictions on Gathering and Movement) Order (No 5) 2020 (NSW) (the Order), hereby grant the following exemption from that order:

- 1. A person is exempt from clause 22 of the Order when participating in a Remembrance Day 2020 service subject to the following conditions:
 - a. There must be a nominated organiser for each service.
 - b. The service does not exceed 100 or the number of persons that is equivalent to 1 person per 4 square metres of space on the premises.
 - c. Each person at the service must take reasonable practical steps to wear a mask during the service.
 - d. The nominated organiser must develop and comply with a COVID-19 Safety Plan that addresses the matters in checklist for funerals, memorial services and wakes.
 - e. Each person participating in the service must provide their name and contact details (including phone number or email address) to the nominated organiser and take reasonably practical steps to comply with the COVID-19 Safety Plan developed by the nominated organiser.
- 2. An occupier of a hospitality venue is exempt from clauses 9(2)(b) and 9(2)(c) of the Order when holding a service to commemorate Remembrance Day 2020 subject to the following conditions:
 - a. The event or service must not exceed the lesser of 100 persons or the number of persons that is equivalent to 1 person per 4 square metres of space on the premises
 - b. The occupier must take reasonably practical steps to ensure that each attendee at the service wears a mask.
 - c. The occupier must take reasonably practical steps to ensure each attendee at the event or service remains 1.5 metres from any other person, other than a member of their household.
 - d. The occupier must record the name and contact details (phone number or email address) of each attendee and the time at which each attendee entered the premises.

- e. The occupier must ensure that hand sanitizer is available for attendees to use.
- f. The occupier must take reasonably practical steps to ensure that attendees do not gather outside the premises before or after the service.
- g. The occupier must develop and comply with a COVID-19 Safety Plan that addresses the matter in the checklist for funerals, memorial services and wakes.

This exemption is repealed on 12 November 2020.
